- 3. The weather was suspicious, so the <u>farm tour</u> was next. Boone's have an awesome fruit selection. The paw paws and apples were nicely fruited. Marc does a very nice job of mulching with hay throughout the farm and it works well. We saw honeyberry, plums, quince, pears, aronia, seaberry, elderberry, autumn olive, cornelian cherry, currants and more. Though they were not recognized in the tour, Boone's also have two huge black walnuts that were heavily fruited...unusual in comparison to most other BW trees this year. - 6. Alan Van Antwerp handed out the <u>Treasurer's Report</u>. No questions or concerns. Alan described the three nut books MNGA has for sale.
- 7. The <u>Spring Meeting Minutes</u> were circulated and accepted as written through motion by Tom McKarns and 2nd by Ray Moses, passed by oral vote.
- 8. Old Business: Trevor plans to put an MNGA subscription payment system on the MNGA website.
- 9. Association's <u>black walnut huller</u>: Dan and Sheila have it and it is for anyone to use. Tom Latterner and Dennis each have a huller and welcome others to bring nuts for hulling in the fall.
- 10. <u>Minutes</u>: discussion about whether to print the Minutes in the MNGA News resulted in consensus that it is better to hand them out at the following meeting, post on-line and save the MNGA News space for interesting articles. The MNGA News can note that the Minutes are posted on-line.
- 11. <u>SIG's</u>: Trevor asked if they have value. Whereas we all have our specialty, it seems that a lot of people are interested in various fruits and nuts. The SIG meetings took a lot of time from the Spring meeting. The website lists the SIG leaders.
